This year Stars Appeal supporters, friends and volunteers have helped to raise thousands of pounds for the NICU Family Accommodation Unit, Pembroke Unit Fund, Cardiac Care and other projects and charitable funds all around the hospital.

### **Highlights of 2011**

**Supercars** at Wilton House roared back for their third year attracting 10,000 people and raising more than £17,000. Thank you to Lord and Lady Pembroke and everyone involved.

**Walk for Wards** once again saw more than 1,000 walkers raise a record amount close to £50,000.

# An Extraordinary Year for the Pembroke Unit

Consultant Haematologist Dr Tamara Everington leads the Pembroke Unit Fund committee, which decides how to use donations to make a difference for patients. Tamara writes: PEMBROKE UNIT FUND

Helping local people live with cancer and blood disorders



"2011 has been an extraordinary year for the Pembroke Unit. We knew that becoming Spire

FM's "Charity of the Year" would bring new opportunities, but had not anticipated quite how much of a boost it would give.

One of the most exciting aspects has been the commitment of our staff and patients who have shown immense energy and innovation in their fundraising efforts. Some cycled to Paris or ran marathons, others held fashion shows, bingo nights and pub quizzes. Our supporters are of all ages including a little girl who held a coffee morning in memory of her daddy and a young boy who cycled many times around a park for his granny.

We have also been successful in gaining a substantial grant from the Kay Kendall Leukaemia Fund and have been gifted new sets of "cold caps" by Walk the Walk to prevent hair loss during chemotherapy.

### So what have we done with all this support?

#### We have:

- Moved into a bright and airy new treatment area for the Pembroke Suite, with a beautiful garden adjoining the waiting room.
- Adapted the Pembroke Suite to include a new treatment preparation area and a kitchen where
  patients can have free drinks and snacks.
- Upgraded our 'quiet' room on the Pembroke Ward and created a new assessment room so that our own staff can review patients if they have complications with their cancer or treatment.
- Built a new outpatient area for oncology patients, separate but near to the Suite and soon to have a beautiful new floor and artwork.
- Created three new consultation rooms with better facilities in our haematology outpatient area.
- Bought a new 'apheresis' machine, so we can collect 'stem cells' from patients who need intensive treatment including transplants.
- Bought a new ultrasound machine to help us put lines into people's veins more easily.
- Continued to develop complementary services such as free aromatherapy massage, support with hair loss and nausea, and a support group to help people get their lives back on track after treatment.

We think the Pembroke Unit provides an excellent service for our patients combining state-of-the-art treatment for cancer in an environment where people are valued and nurtured. We know from our regular feedback that our patients believe this too. Donations to the Stars Appeal Pembroke Unit Fund help greatly in achieving this - thank you!"

"When we first arrived on the Pembroke Unit it was all a bit daunting, so what a surprise and pleasure it was to be told that I could have a massage of either my hands or feet...

# The Most Eagerly Awaited Accommodation In Salisbury?


Not a new 'hip hotel', but the Family Accommodation Unit coming to Salisbury District Hospital's NeoNatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in 2012.

Building work on the new NICU is scheduled to begin early in 2012 and we hope that staff and babies will move in late spring. Then work can start on converting and extending the old NICU to create the new Family Accommodation Unit. The plan is to complete this by the autumn and we'll be holding an open day for all our supporters to view this much-anticipated new facility.

Since the project began we've been able to increase the capacity of the Unit from two to four en-suite family bedrooms, so we will be able to support twice as many families with babies born too small, too sick or too soon.
